


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WEEK 1	MONDAY	TUESDAY
<p><b>RULES</b></p> 	<p><input type="checkbox"/> <b>Be honest.</b> Introduce telling the truth. To tell the truth means to say what is true.</p> <p><input type="checkbox"/> To lie is telling what is false—not true. Lying is wrong. Telling the truth is right.</p>	<p><input type="checkbox"/> <b>Be honest.</b> Review telling the truth. Example: John took something that did not belong to him. Telling the truth sounds like this: "John, did you take it?" "Yes, I did."</p>
<p><b>HEALTH</b></p> 	<p><input type="checkbox"/> <b>Good books are good for our minds.</b> Good books help us think well.</p>	<p><input type="checkbox"/> <b>Good books are good for our minds.</b> Each day we can read or listen to a good book.</p>
<p><b>MANNERS</b></p> 	<p><input type="checkbox"/> <b>It is good manners to take care of our own property and the property of others.</b> When you read a book, take good care of it. Turn pages carefully.</p>	<p><input type="checkbox"/> <b>It is good manners to take care of our own property and the property of others.</b> Take good care of your books. Never drop a book or rip its pages. Keep books in good condition.</p>
<p><b>SAFETY</b></p> 	<p><input type="checkbox"/> <b>To take good care of ourselves, we need to be safe.</b> "Safe" is the opposite of "dangerous" (not safe). Always stay with an adult you trust, so you can be safe.</p>	<p><input type="checkbox"/> <b>To take good care of ourselves, we need to be safe.</b> Before you go somewhere, you must ask an adult, "May I go outside?" An adult needs to be with you and know where you are at all times.</p>
<p><b>LISTENING</b></p>  <p><b>Honesty and Integrity</b>  <i>Abe Lincoln:</i>  <i>The boy who loved books</i></p>	<p><input type="checkbox"/> <b>We can know what is right and what is wrong.</b> We can be honest and tell the truth. We will read a story today about a boy who was known to be honest. (Read <i>Abe Lincoln</i>.)</p>	<p><input type="checkbox"/> <b>We can know what is right and what is wrong.</b> Today pay special attention to hear how much Abe Lincoln loved books. Abe Lincoln learned from good books. (Reread the book.)</p>

WEDNESDAY	THURSDAY – Let's Practice!
<input type="checkbox"/> <b>Be honest.</b> If you did something you were not supposed to do, tell the truth about it. If you did <i>not</i> do something you <i>were</i> supposed to do, tell the truth.	<input type="checkbox"/> <b>Be honest.</b> "Is your name (child's name)?" (Yes, it is.) "Is your name (insert a different name)?" (No, it is not.) Telling the truth is being honest. This is good and right.
<input type="checkbox"/> <b>Good books are good for our minds.</b> Good books tell us important information and give us stories to think about.	<input type="checkbox"/> <b>Good books are good for our minds.</b> Read or listen to at least one good book today.
<input type="checkbox"/> <b>It is good manners to take care of our own property and the property of others.</b> The next time we read <i>Abe Lincoln</i> , you will hold the book and turn the pages gently to practice.	<input type="checkbox"/> <b>It is good manners to take care of our own property and the property of others.</b> Name one or two ways you could take better care of your books. (Place them neatly on a shelf. Keep them off the floor.)
<input type="checkbox"/> <b>To take good care of ourselves, we need to be safe.</b> Never wander away. Wandering by yourself is dangerous. You must always stay with your family or with a trusted adult that your parents know.	<input type="checkbox"/> <b>To take good care of ourselves, we need to be safe.</b> Pretend you would like to go outside right now. Practice asking permission to do this. ("May I go outside?") Ask permission, and ask an adult to go with you!
<input type="checkbox"/> <b>We can know what is right and what is wrong.</b> (Reread the book.) What did people say that "Honest Abe" did when he owed someone six cents?
